
The Borough of Bury

Arriving in Bury – Money and Immediate Support

When you arrive in Bury once your host informs us of your arrival you will be contacted by a member of our team, who will give you £200 to help you with immediate financial support for food, transport costs and settling into life here. This money does NOT have to be repaid.

Setting up a Bank Account:

You will need to set up a UK bank account in order to receive wages from any employment and to receive Universal Credit or other benefits. You can do this in person by visiting a bank, or most banks have an online application option.

Your sponsor will be able to show you the nearest bank to where you are staying.

Benefits:

We can support you with getting a job and help you find out which benefits you may be able to get including:

Universal Credit: Ukrainian nationals can access Universal Credit as soon as they arrive in the UK. This is a monthly payment for those of working age, to help with your living costs if you are on a low income. You could be working (including self-employed or part time) or be out of work.

Pension Credit - extra money to help with your living costs if you are over the state pension age and on a low income.

Disability Benefits – extra money to help with additional costs if you have a long term physical or mental health condition or disability

Carer's Allowance – extra money if you care for someone at least 35 hours a week.

Child Benefit – extra money to help with the cost of raising a child.

National Insurance number: Your National Insurance number is unique to you. It is a combination of letter and numbers. It never changes. You need a National Insurance number to be able to work or receive benefits in the UK, however you can look for and start work without a National Insurance number if you can prove your right to work in the UK. British Red Cross

The British Red Cross are giving Ukrainian guests a choice of 2 free sim cards. Please direct your guests to the British Red Cross support number 0808 1963651 and select option 3. They must be applied for within the first 14 days after arrival and the guest themselves must apply.

The Red cross will complete a form which will be emailed to them to check, and they must return the form with photos of passport, visa, and date of entry stamp. They can request a free sim card.

Emergencies

In an emergency

The UK's emergency telephone number is 999.

You can call this number for free from any telephone and it will get you through to the emergency services.

You can then ask for the Police, Fire or Ambulance.

Police services in Bury are run by Greater Manchester Police. Ask to speak to the police if:

- a serious crime is taking place or offence has just been committed
- someone is in immediate danger or harm

Greater Manchester Fire and Rescue Service tackle fires but will also help if anyone is in trouble in a lake or river.

NHS medical emergencies: If it's a medical emergency ask for the **ambulance** service to get the patient to a hospital. If you or a family member has an accident or a sudden serious illness you should go to your nearest hospital with an A&E department which is free for everyone. **Your local Accident & Emergency (A&E) hospital** is: Fairfield General Hospital, 483 Rochdale Old Rd, Bury BL9 7TD

If it is not an emergency

Water safety

- If you go swimming or are near water, remember:
- Only swim at the beach and other places if lifeguards are present
- Water is colder than it looks, which can affect your ability to swim if you get into trouble
- Don't go too far and always swim parallel to the shore
- If you get caught in a riptide, swim with the current so you don't tire yourself out.
 Call for help.
- Don't swim alone always take someone with you
- If you are in trouble in water, shout for help and float or swim on your back.
- If someone else is in trouble in water, call 999 immediately. Throw them something that floats so they can hold onto it.

Health and Social Care Services

Health services is the UK are provided by the National Health Service (NHS) for free. However, in some cases such as with opticians and some dentists you may have to pay.

Doctors (GP):

Your 'GP' is your main point of contact at the NHS. 'GP' stands for General Practitioner. They are also known as family doctors. GPs are highly skilled doctors who are trained in all aspects of general medicine. They can provide you with advice about your health. They can also get you in touch with specialist doctors.

You will need to register with a GP Practice: www.nhs.uk/nhs-services/gps

To see a GP or nurse, you need to book an appointment. You can do this by ringing your practice. If you need an interpreter you must tell the receptionist when you make the appointment. Tell the staff which language you speak and they will book an interpreter for you or get an interpreter on the phone. It is important that you and the doctor understand each other so that they can make an accurate diagnosis of your problem. You will not be charged if you require an interpreter. Everything discussed in the consultation is confidential including anything discussed in the presence of an interpreter.

Getting a prescription for medicines

You will need to visit your new GP to get a prescription and then take their prescription to a pharmacy or chemist to receive the medication. You may need to pay for prescription medicines. Hospital

The main hospital in Bury is Fairfield General Hospital at 483 Rochdale Old Rd, Bury BL9 7TD. It has an accident and emergency department (A&E) you can travel to if you don't need an ambulance in an emergency. Please don't visit A&E unless it is an emergency – otherwise call your doctor.

School Nurses

The Bury School Nursing Teams offer health advice and support for all children attending Bury Schools and Colleges starting from Reception class age, until their 20th Birthday. College pupils have open access to the service and can be referred at any point. Any children who are not enrolled at school at age 4 remain with the Health Visiting Service until their 5th Birthday. Dentistry Services

Ukrainian nationals can register with a dentist as either an NHS patient or a private patient. Urgent Mental Health Support

Bury Access and Crisis Team: The single point of access for all referrals into mental health services. The team aims to see you within 14 days of receiving your referrals. If your referral is urgent, please contact the team on 0161 716 1080 to discuss your situation with the duty worker, as they may be able to offer an appointment quicker than this.

Mental Health Support for Children and Young People

Children and young people can get advice and support from the Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS). The service can help with things like low mood, anxiety, sleep problems, trauma and loss. The service may help directly or point towards more appropriate support. Getting support for children

Fleeing conflict in Ukraine may place particular strain on children, and it might create difficulties within family relationships. The purpose of our Children's Social Care service is to keep children safe and well. We intervene if a child is suffering and also provide parents with help and support. This might be if a parent is too unwell to look after their child, or if their child has additional or special needs.

If you have serious concerns about a child's welfare

Child abuse can involve physical injury, neglect, emotional or sexual abuse. It can involve a parent, another family member or someone else the child knows well, or it could be someone the child does not know.

If you suspect or believe a child is suffering or is likely to suffer significant harm, including any form of mistreatment or abuse, you should report your concerns.

If you are concerned about the welfare of a child – call 999 in an emergency. If there is no immediate danger, or you need advice or information, you can telephone the

Ukrainian nationals can apply for a school place for a child as soon as you arrive.

Starting school can help children settle in and make friends. A parent can apply for a school place for their child.

The application will be considered under Bury's school admission arrangements, as all applications are. The outcome will depend on the number of places available at local schools.

Free School Meals

All children in reception, Year 1 and Year 2 get a free meal at lunchtime, under the government's Infant Free School Meals scheme. These are provided at all Bury Council maintained schools, academies, free schools, and pupil referral units. Children's Centres/Early Help Locality Teams

Early Help means identifying needs within families early and providing preventive support and intervention before they become difficult to address, support can be provided at any time in a child's or young person's life, pre-birth to adulthood. Support can be delivered from a wide range of services depending on what is needed; people already working with your family might offer additional help or support so that you can access more specialist or targeted services.

The Locality Early Help teams support all 5 neighbourhoods across the borough and are physically based in the Children Centres in Bury, Radcliffe and Whitefield. The teams support children and young people, age 0-19, and their families (25 years if SEND) and are able to offer advice and guidance to ensure that children and their families are given the best opportunities in life. Upon display of a passport and boarding pass/ticket showing an arrival date in the UK, Ukrainian nationals arriving in Greater Manchester are eligible to travel for free for up to 48 hours from point of arrival to final UK destination.

Tram (Metrolink)

There are tram stations in Bury Town Centre, Radcliffe, Besses, Whitefield and Prestwich. Buy your ticket from the machine at the station before you travel

Trams provide transport to Manchester City Centre, Oldham, Rochdale, Ashton, Eccles, Manchester Airport, Didsbury and Altrincham

Buses

Bus services run throughout Bury, as well as connecting Bury to local towns

- For Manchester use bus numbers 98, 135
- For Bolton use bus number 471
- For Rochdale use bus number 471

Taxis

- Black cab taxis can be used from the street
- Other taxis, called private hire vehicles (ordinary cars) need to be booked in advance

Road safety

To drive in the UK you will need valid driver's license and valid insurance. The vehicle being driven should be taxed and roadworthy. In the UK driving is on the LEFT hand side of the road.

To stay safe on the road:

- don't drive under the influence of alcohol or drugs
- · don't use a mobile phone while driving
- stay within the speed limit the speed signs are in miles per hour.
- wear your seatbelt and make sure passengers do too
- call 999 if you are involved in a collision and it is an emergency

Driving License

Driving licence requirements for Ukrainians living in Great Britain on a Ukraine visa scheme: If you are a Ukrainian national living in Great Britain (GB) on a Ukraine visa scheme and you hold a Ukrainian driving licence, you: can drive in GB; you do not need to exchange your Ukrainian licence for a GB licence; the length of time you can continue to drive in GB depends on when you successfully applied for entry clearance or permission to stay in the United Kingdom.
